Session notes

At the stated meeting of the Session of Crossroads Church which was held on October 16, 2008, the following was noted/voted upon:

- Communion was served to 59 persons on October 5th;
- the Personnel Committee has completed the annual reviews of the pastor and employees and updated job descriptions of the organist and secretary;
- A congregational meeting will be held on October 26th immediately following the worship service to elect officers for 2009.
- David Lang, treasurer, attended the meeting. The budget is on track, \$3900 in the black.
- Long range planning meetings will be held early in 2009. Officer training will be held with new officers before their ordination/installation.
- It was voted to approve an alternative gift fair, sponsored by the youth group, to be held on December 6 and 7.
- It was voted to take approximately \$150 from memorial funds for the Christmas cantata material.
- The next stated meeting will be held on Sunday, November 9, 2008 at 5 p.m the church. It will be a joint meeting with the Boards of Deacons and Trustees and will include dinner.

Habitat volunteers are working hard on the last 2 of the 6 houses at Davis Farm Way in New London. One project is called the "Community Build," and the second is the "Youth Build." To volunteer, go to the Habitat web site at www.habitatsect.org and click on "Volunteer Up" --- that's the way to find out what dates are available and what skills are needed. If you've never volunteered for Habitat, you need to go to a short meeting called Foundations of Habitat, which is given every 2nd Saturday of the month at 10 am at the Habitat Office at 377 Broad Street, New London.

Volunteers are also needed at the Habitat Restore, located on the grounds of Salem Country Gardens on Rte. 85. The Restore is a great place to buy whatever you need to fix up or decorate your home.

Homeless Hospitality Center (HHC)

Crossroads Church congregation supports HHC in many ways. The Mission Committee and individuals give monetary donations: Youth Group members donate paper goods, sandwiches and snacks; and members of the congregation give generously when requests are made for paper goods, lemonade powder, snacks, cans of tuna for use by the sandwich makers; provide sandwiches on Sundays, and volunteer at HHC on weeknights and Sundays. If you are interested in volunteering at HHC on a weeknight, please call Deb Irving at 860-434-1460. If you would care to visit HHC on a Sunday night, please let me know.

HHC at St. James Church, New London, have indicated that, for health reasons, items containing peanut butter may not be distributed on their premises. Sandwiches of white or brown bread (two loaves provide 20) may contain tuna, egg, meat, cheese, etc. Our sandwiches have been described by the guests as "always yummy". As the weather grows colder, the number of guests is increasing – we had a full house last Sunday. With your support, we must increase the number of sandwiches we provide to 60 (20 per volunteer) each Sunday. Please consider adding your name to the revised list in the narthex.

New church policy

The Session recently approved the following policy. If you have any questions about it, please contact a Session member.

Church Policy Solicitation of Funds

It is a fact of life today that we are all bombarded with financial appeals from all sides—through the mail, at the office, on radio and television, via phone (often at dinnertime), email, at the market, on the front porch from neighbor children, and, yes, at church, too.

We, the Session, believe the primary purpose of solicitation of funds at Crossroads Presbyterian Church is to support the worship of God. The Session clearly has a responsibility in this regard to approve and monitor solicitations of funds on Church property. Your Session, at its June 18, 2008 meeting approved the establishment of a written policy in that regard. That written policy is as follows:

Effective henceforth, any church group or individual member within the congregation of Crossroads Presbyterian Church who wishes to solicit funds for any purpose on church property or during a church event, including solicitation utilizing the church mailing list, shall obtain formal permission from the Session in advance.

The procedure for requesting permission for solicitation of funds is to present a written request to a member of Session in advance of the scheduled meeting of the Session, and in advance of the requested date of solicitation. The written request should explain the solicitation sufficiently for the Session to make an informed decision.

Church announcements are published in the bulletin insert, monthly newsletter, and weekly e-mail updates. Many important events in our community are also publicized on the bulletin boards and the church website (which also lists a weekly schedule of events). Please contact the church office when you have news of interest to the congregation. This allows us to give equal time to the many happenings in our church and communities. If it's important that an announcement be made during the worship service, don't hesitate to contact Rev. Fuhrmeister.
